

Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) Facts

- 1 in 3 women and 1 in 4 men have experienced some form of physical violence by an intimate partner.
- 1 in 4 women and 1 in 7 men have been victims of severe physical violence (e.g. beating, burning, strangling) by an intimate partner in their lifetime.
- On average, nearly 20 people per minute are physically abused by an intimate partner in the United States. During one year, this equates to more than 10 million women and men.
- 85% of youth that grow up within a violent home go on to become abusive themselves without intervention.
- Intimate partner violence accounts for 15% of all violent crime.

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What Is Intimate Partner Violence (IPV)?

Intimate partner violence (IPV), defined as sexual violence, stalking, physical violence, and psychological aggression perpetrated by an intimate partner, affects nearly a [third of all Americans](#) at some point in their lives. Although IPV affects men and women of all ages, women, particularly young women and women of color experience IPV at higher rates.

People who are victimized by their partners are more likely to experience health problems and both the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) have identified IPV has a significant public health issue in the US.
